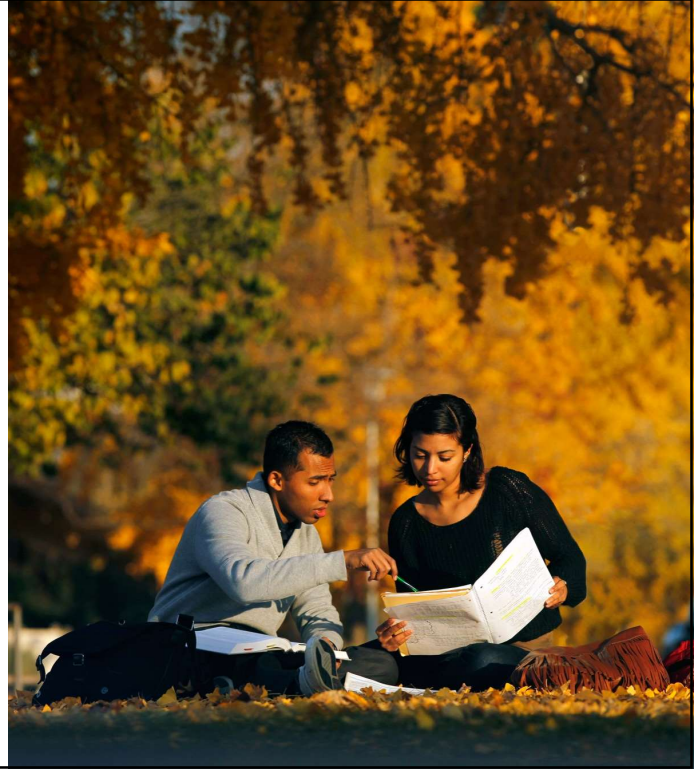

Meeting Changing Needs

Flexibility and Fairness

Example: A married student moves to California to attend graduate school and for her partner's work.



Proposed Changes to §41905.5

Financial independence shall not be considered in a reclassification analysis if the student meets at least one of the following criteria:

- A. Dependent on a parent who has California residence for more than one year immediately preceding the residence determination date;
- B. Enrolled in a graduate or post-baccalaureate program, regardless of age;
- C. Turned 24 years of age by the residence determination date;
- D. Married or registered domestic partner as of the residence determination date;

Proposed Changes to §41905.5 - Continued

Financial independence shall not be considered in a reclassification analysis if the student meets at least one of the following criteria:

- E. Active duty members serving in the U.S. Armed Forces
- F. Legal dependent other than a spouse or registered domestic partner
- G. Former ward of the court, foster youth or both parents are deceased
- H. Declared by a court to be an emancipated minor
- I. Unaccompanied youth who is homeless or at risk of becoming homeless

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
