- 95% of undergraduates are from California






We Invest in the Future






We Are California's State University

Test FREE Admissions

- High school graduate or equivalent
- Complete the 15-unit "a-g" college preparatory courses
- Earn qualifying "a-g" grade point average (GPA)
 - CA Residents: 2.5 or greater
 - Between 2.0 & 2.49 may be evaluated based on supplemental factors

Multi-Factor Admission Score

Primary Factors

- GPA in all completed a-g courses (courses after 9th grade 11th grade)
- GPA and courses taken in subjects relevant to selected major
- Number of academic courses beyond the minimum a-g requirements

Secondary Factors

- Location of high school and educational opportunities available (free & reduced lunch, CCPI, Other)
- Student attributes: First generation, Low income, Foster youth, Military service
- Activities/Engagement outside of school: Extracurricular activities,
 Work/Volunteer experience, Leadership roles




What Students Need to Apply

Unofficial transcripts You'll be asked to enter all the courses you've completed on your CSU application; those that are currently in progress; and any you plan to take. Transcripts will be requested by campuses as needed.
Test scores (SAT, ACT, AP or IB) Report test results so far as well as any future test dates. Reporting of your ACT and SAT test scores is not required. If you have taken the ACT or SAT and have already sent your scores to a CSU campus, you can add your information to your Cal State Appl Application. If you have not sent your scores to a CSU campus, you can self-report this information but no further action is needed at this time. If you are accepted, your SAT and ACT results will only be used as one of the measures to place you in the proper mathematics and English courses.
Your Social Security number, if you have one.
Your citizenship status
A method of payment You can pay the application fee by credit card.
Your parent's/guardian's citizenship status
Annual income Your parents' if you are a dependent; your income if you are independent
Your parent's employment background and two recommendations Applies only if you're applying to EOP.
California statewide student ID Optional; every K-12 student in a California public school is assigned an ID number. The number should be printed on your transcript.

Dual Enrollment/College Coursework


- Applicants should specify that they are a Graduating High School Senior with College Credit.
- All college courses that will appear on a college transcript would be reported on the college coursework page
- Applicants will then add the appropriate A-G category to each college course manually
- The application will automatically grant a full year of high school credit for each college course inputted





High School Courses

REMINDER: Add summer grade levels too if you took A-G courses during that summer



REMINDER: Add middle school math and/or language other than English, if applicable

Review the instructions below very carefully. Failure to follow instructions will delay your admission decision your admission decision.

Report all courses that will be used to satisfy the A-G subject requirements. Do not include non-college prep Health or Physical Education.

California high school students: the course title appears once you enter the first few letters of the title. If course High Schools Attended section and confirm that your high school was selected from the available option California high school or high school courses is highly discouraged and will delay the processing of your appropriate the course of the title. If course the High School was selected from the available option.

Academic History

Be sure to add any math (algebra or higher) and/or language other than English courses (LOTE level 1 or higher) taken in middle school and have continued the course progression into 9th grade to receive consideration. You can then assign them to an A-G area. If you are unsure which A-G area your course falls under, visit the A-G Course List.

If you took a course for only one term, select No Course for the term you will not earn a grade in.

If you completed college courses while in high school, report those courses in the College Coursework section. If you took college courses while in high school and do not see the college coursework section available, go back to your Extended Profile and be sure you indicated that you completed college coursework while in high school.




The CSU Educational Opportunity Program (EOP)

- Students who are historically low-income and educationally disadvantaged who need admission assistance and support services to succeed in college.
- The EOP application is built into the Cal State Apply application.
 Students can submit the Cal State Apply application without the EOP portion complete and come back to it.
- Student can come back to the EOP portion of the application after they submit until January 15th
- Some campuses require students to complete EOP portion earlier (November 30th)

Eligible

A Fee Waiver is an application fee discount granted to applicants who meet the specific requirements described in the Cal State Apply instructions. The fee waiver amount covers all application fees for up to the maximum number of eligible programs. Your Available Application Fee Waivers Per Term Fall 4 of 4

Eligibility Rules

- If you are eligible, Cal State Apply automatically applies the fee waiver amount to your account balance for eligible programs during the checkout/payment process.
- If you apply to programs that exceed your total number of fee waivers or programs that are not
 eligible for fee waivers, you are responsible for additional program fees.
- Fee waivers expire at the end of each term application filing period.




