





STUDENT SUCCESS TEAMS

Key to CSUF's comprehensive approach to education are the graduation, retention, and college career specialists that comprise the University's student success teams, who help increase graduation rates, reduce the time to earn a degree, and narrow the achievement gap among underrepresented students.

STRATEGIES

- Increase support through Student Success Teams
- Implement Student Success Dashboard to track student progress data
- Launch digital awareness campaign of CSUF's Finish in Four program to encourage students to enroll in summer, intersessions, increase course load to complete degree in four years.

CALIFORNIA PROMISE

The "California Promise" is a guarantee from the California State University system that a first-time freshman can earn a degree in no more than four years (or two years, for transfer students having earned an Associate Degree for Transfer- ADT) if you pledge to, and follow, specific requirements. Graduating in four years (or two, as an ADT Transfer) will save you tuition and books/materials costs.


