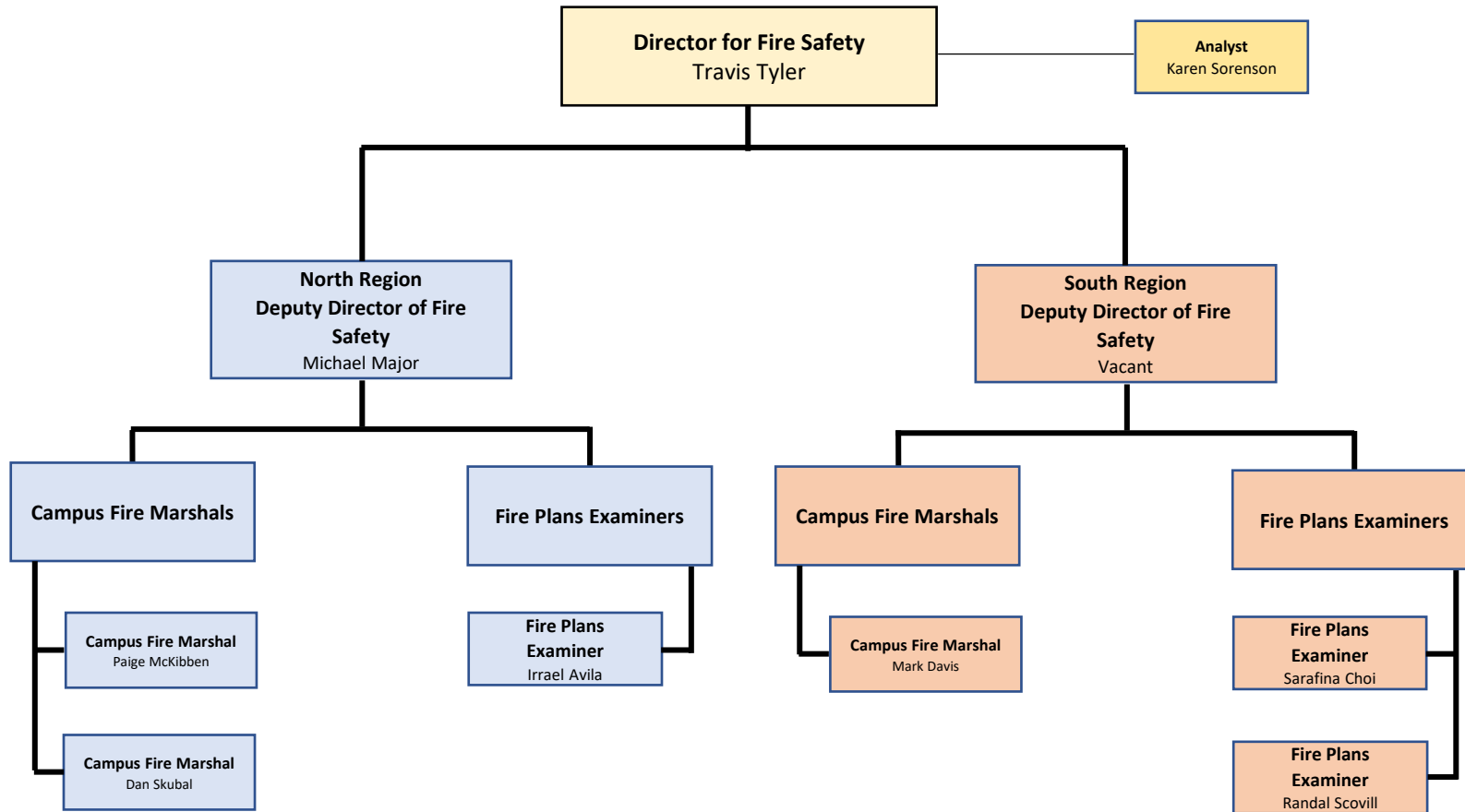

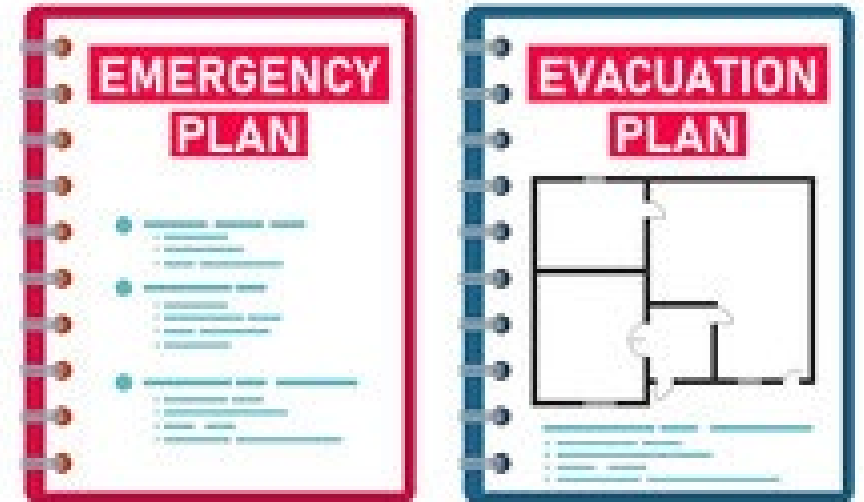

New to 2023

- Reporting of emergencies, coordination with emergency response forces, emergency plans and procedures for managing or responding to emergencies shall comply with the California Fire Code.
- In addition, occupancies, uses and outdoor locations shall comply with the emergency preparedness requirements, evacuation drills, and employee training shall be in accordance with the California Fire Code

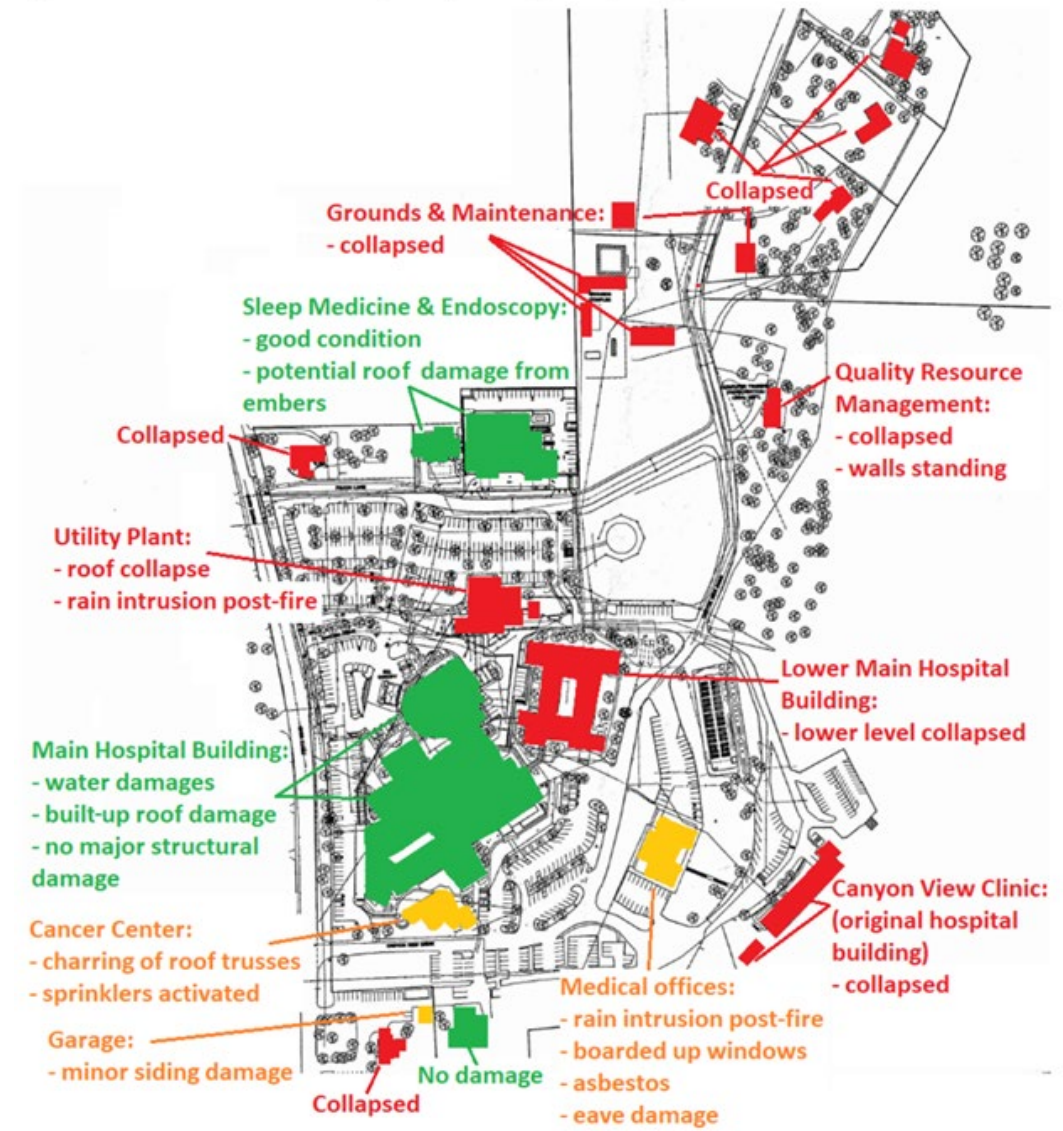

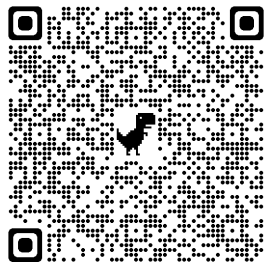
Fire Hazard Severity Zone (FHSZ)
