  - a. No subcommittee meeting this month on the WestEd Implementation Studies Project (ISP) immediately following the APEP meeting.

  - b. Responses have been received from the Chancellor's Office to the January ASCSU Resolutions. Of particular interest to APEP will be:
    - i. **AS-3355-18/APEP/AA (Rev): Requirements for Faculty Discipline Review Group Membership in Support of the Development and Oversight of Transfer Model Curricula** We appreciate the call for greater faculty participation in FDRG. In particular, we acknowledge the expansion of eligible faculty beyond that of only tenured full professors. This will provide a greater number of well-qualified faculty to engage in the Transfer Model Curriculum (TMC) and Model Curriculum (MC) development and review process. We agree with the need to bring new CSU faculty into the Associate Degree for Transfer (ADT) process as it matures. Additionally, it is vital that the CSU be an equal partner with the California Community Colleges in the development and oversight of ADTs.
    - ii. **AS-3356-18/APEP/AA (Rev): Creation of California State University Curriculum Networks** The Office of the Chancellor will continue to rely on the expertise of faculty in the development of Transfer Model Curriculum (TMC). In addition, we have supported the work around C-ID course descriptor review. This includes support for the necessary interaction and meetings to carry out that work. Where there is a need for intra-system collaboration in support of defined objectives, we will continue to support that activity on a case-by-case basis.
