The CSU was deficient in the Antifreeze, Glass, Lubricating Oils, Paint, and Tire categories for several reasons: - These items are often purchased by Facilities and Capital departments, which operate outside of Procurement and reporting procedures are harder to implement and enforce because of this. - The Buy Recycled coordinators who generate the campus reports are from Procurement and coordinating with those in the other departments responsible for these types of purchases can be challenging. - Vendors oftentimes do not give campuses adequate information about the Recycled content of purchases up front. - Recording and reporting procedures systemwide are not standardized at the present time. The Printing and Paper products fell short of the 50% threshold because the Staples has been defaulting paper orders to a 30/70 recycled to new pulp breakdown for our paper orders. The CSU is working to increase that standard to 50/50 going forward and we anticipate meeting the threshold in the coming Fiscal Year.
